		Between these dates, the Registrar of Voters shall publish a notice of election in a newspaper of general circulation in the district. The notice shall contain the date of the general district election, name of the offices for which candidates may file, and the qualifications required by the principal act for each office. The notice shall state the location where official declarations of candidacy for eligible candidates desiring to file for any of the elective offices may be obtained, the office in which completed declarations of candidacy are required to be filed, and the date and time after which no declarations of candidacy may be accepted for filing. A copy of the notice shall be delivered to the district secretary and superintendent and shall be posted in the district office. Notice of central counting place may be combined with this notice.

A request for a vote-by-mail ballot from a military or overseas voter will be deemed an affidavit of registration and an application for permanent voter-by-mail status.

		Last day for military or overseas voters to register to vote. A request for a vote-by-mail ballot from a military or overseas voter, if postmarked on or before this date, will be deemed an affidavit of registration and an application for permanent voter-by-mail status. When a county elections official receives and approves a registration application from a miltary or overseas voter, the official must provide that voter with a vote-by-mail ballot for each subsequent election for federal office in the state unless the voter fails to vote in four consecutive statewide general elections.
