7/3/2026 E-123	District	Administrative deadline to file the resolution requesting election services and measure consolidation with the ROV and the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors. Resolution shall include: (1) Request for ROV to provide services, (2) Question, proposition, or office to be voted upon at the election.

7/6/2026 - 8/5/2026 E-120 to E-90	ROV	Between these dates, the ROV shall publish a Notice of Election in a newspaper of general circulation in the district. The notice shall contain the date of the election, the offices to be filled, where nomination papers are available and the deadline for filing Declarations of Candidacy. The notice may be combined with the notice of identifying the central county place.

The fee may be represented by money, signatures in-lieu, or a prorated combination of money and signatures in-lieu. <b><u>The filing fee is non-refundable.</u></b> Candidates may authorize in writing that their in-lieu signatures count toward the number of signatures needed for their Nomination Paper.

7/13/2026 - 8/7/2026 E-113 to E-88	Candidates / ROV	Between these dates, candidates for judicial and county offices may prepare a Statement of Qualifications, not to exceed 200 words, to be included in the Voter's Information Guide. The statement will remain confidential until deadline for filing has passed. The statement may not be changed, but may be withdrawn up to 5:00 p.m. on August 10, 2026 if the contest closes on August 7, 2026 or August 11, 2026 if the contests closes on August 8, 2026 after the extension period. A written request to withdraw a Candidate Statement must be sent to the ROV Office prior to the deadline listed above.

The statement may not be changed, but may be withdrawn up to 5:00 p.m. on August 10, 2026 if the contest closes on August 7, 2026 or August 11, 2026 if the contests closes on August 8, 2026 after the extension period.

8/5/2026 - 11/3/2026 E-90 to E-Day	Candidates	<p>During the 90 days immediately preceding an election and including Election Day, the following contributions that total in the aggregate of \$1,000 or more must be reported within 24 hours to the Registrar of Voters.</p> <p><b>Form 496:</b> File if independent expenditures of \$1,000 or more are made.</p> <p><b>Form 497:</b> File if a contribution of \$1,000 or more in the aggregate is received from a single source.</p> <p><b>Form 497:</b> File if a contribution of \$1,000 or more in the aggregate is made to a candidate or measure being voted upon March 5, 2024, or to a political party committee.</p> <p><b>Non-Monetary Contribution:</b> The recipient of a non-monetary contribution of \$1,000 or more must file a Form 497 report within 48 hours from the time the contribution is received. File by personal delivery, email, guaranteed overnight service, fax or online if available.</p>

8/7/2026 E-88	Candidates / Registrar of Voters	Deadline for a candidate to file a Declaration of Candidacy and Nomination papers with the ROV.

8/7/2026 E-88	Candidates	No candidate whose declaration of candidacy has been filed for any primary election may withdraw as a candidate at that primary election after filing deadline.

8/13/2026 E-82	ROV	If there are insufficient nominees for the offices to be filled, and a petition requesting the election be held has not been presented to the officer conducting the election, then the election shall not be held. The ROV shall request the Board of Supervisors to appoint the qualified candidate(s) to such office. If there are no candidates, the supervising authority shall appoint a qualified person to each office. Persons appointed shall qualify and serve as if elected.

9/4/2026 E-60	ROV	First day the ROV may process applications for military or overseas voter ballots. Any applications received by the ROV prior to this day shall be kept and processed on or after this date. If the applicant is not a resident of the county to which he or she has applied, the ROV receiving the application shall forward it immediately to the proper county.

9/24/2026 - 10/13/2026 E-40 to E-21	Secretary of State / ROV	Between these dates, the ROV shall mail a Voter Information Guide and Sample Ballot with a polling place notice to each registered voter. Between these dates the Secretary of State shall mail state Voter Information Guides to each registered voter.
<b>Last Day to Register to Vote to Ensure Receipt of Sample Ballot by Mail</b> EC §9094, 13303		
10/5/2026 E-29	Voters	This is the last day voters may register to vote in order to ensure the receipt of a Voter Information Guide by mail. Voter registration cards received by this date will be added to the rolls and the voters will receive a Voter Information Guide booklet prepared by the ROV. Voters who submit cards after this date will not receive a County Voter Information Guide and Sample Ballot by mail; however, they will receive notification of registration received.

<b>Processing Vote-by-Mail Ballots</b> EC §15101		
10/5/2026 E-29	ROV	On this day, the ROV may begin to process vote-by-mail ballots including verifying the voter's signature on the vote-by-mail ballot return envelope, opening vote-by-mail ballot return envelopes, removing ballots, duplicating any damaged ballots, preparation of ballot to be machine read, or machine reading them. However, under no circumstances may a vote count be accessed or released until 8:00 p.m. on the day of the election.

The Voter Registration form may also be submitted by this date to the Secretary of State, Department of Motor Vehicles, or any National Voter Registration Act designated agency.</p> <p><b>Military and Overseas Voters:</b> A request for a vote-by-mail ballot from a military or overseas voter, if postmarked on or before this date, will be deemed an affidavit of registration and an application for permanent vote-by-mail status.</p>
<b>Conditional Registration Period</b> EC §2170		
10/20/2026 - 11/3/2026 E-14 to E-Day	ROV	<p>Voters who missed the voter registration deadline can still register and vote up to and including Election Day at the Imperial County Registrar of Voters' Office located at 940 West Main Street, Suite 206, El Centro, CA or any Vote Center. Ballots will be counted after the elections official verifies the voter's registration and confirms that they have not already voted in the election.</p>

10/22/2026 E-12	Candidates / Committees / ROV	<p>Last day to file campaign statements for candidates and committees covering the period of September 20 - October 17, 2026. Statement must be sent by personal delivery or guaranteed overnight delivery.</p>

10/24/2026 - 11/3/2026 E-10 to E-Day	ROV	<p>Beginning 10 days before Election Day, 1 Vote Center for every 50,000 registered voters as of the 88th day shall be open for a minimum of 8 hours and from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. on Election Day.</p>
<b>4-Day Vote Centers Open</b> EC §4005 (a)(3)(A)

11/10/2026 E+7	ROV	<p>Vote-by-Mail ballots that are postmarked on or before Election Day or are date stamped by a bona fide private mail delivery company on or before Election Day, and received by the ROV no later than 7 days after Election Day shall be considered received on time.</p> <p>If the ballot has no postmark, a postmark with no date or an illegible postmark, the vote-by-mail ballot identification envelope must be signed and dated by the voter pursuant to Elections Code §3011 on or before Election Day in order to be considered received on time.</p>

Voters will have until 2 days before certification of the election to provide their signature on a statement and file it with the ROV.

5 Days After Canvass	ROV	Within five (5) days after the completion of the official canvass, any voter may request a recount by filing a written request with the ROV, specifying which candidate(s) and/or measures are to be recounted. The petitioning voter shall, before commencement of each day's recount, deposit such sum as the ROV deems required to cover costs of the recount. "Completion of the canvass" shall be the time when the ROV signs the certified Statement of Vote.

12/3/2026 E+30	ROV	No later than this date, the ROV shall send one copy of the Statement of Vote to the Secretary of State.
<b>Certificates of Election or Nomination to be Prepared</b> EC §8145, 8146, 8147		
12/4/2026 E+31	ROV	The county ROV will prepare certificates of election for each candidate elected for nonpartisan offices voted for wholly within one county. The Secretary of State will prepare certificates of nomination for Congressional and Legislative candidates.
